The Blue Ape

The title of A. G. Sloan's new book, This, That, and Another Thing, accurately reflects the diverse and engaging contents-truly, there's something for every reader. The section called "This" collects Sloan's observations about everyday life.

In these short pieces, he points out the absurdity in everything from the battle of the sexes to reality television. Sloan's observations about marriage, family, politics, and culture will make you laugh and make you think. The "That" section includes a longer-form memoir about Sloan's early childhood in Chicago, Illinois. He chronicles the trials of being a Catholic school student and his adventures as a young man in seminary. Although Sloan's narrative ends before he goes into too much depth about his adult life, it's clear how the smart and perceptive teenager cultivated his curiosity and went on to become a sly observer of American life. The last section, "Another Thing," is, logically enough, about something completely different. In this part, Sloan includes two short stories. One is a tragic look at a failing marriage. The second is based on Sloan's own early work experiences. Together, they reveal a different side of the author and serve as a thought-provoking end to an eclectic collection.

Dodge Caravan Chrysler Voyager & Town & Country

The New York Times bestselling author of *Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker* and *Mrs. Lincoln's Rival* imagines the inner life of Julia Grant, beloved as a Civil War general's wife and the First Lady, yet who grappled with a profound and complex relationship with the slave who was her namesake—until she forged a proud identity of her own. In 1844, Missouri belle Julia Dent met dazzling horseman Lieutenant Ulysses S Grant. Four years passed before their parents permitted them

to wed, and the groom's abolitionist family refused to attend the ceremony. Since childhood, Julia owned as a slave another Julia, known as Jule. Jule guarded her mistress's closely held twin secrets: She had perilously poor vision but was gifted with prophetic sight. So it was that Jule became Julia's eyes to the world. And what a world it was, marked by gathering clouds of war. The Grants vowed never to be separated, but as Ulysses rose through the ranks—becoming general in chief of the Union Army—so did the stakes of their pact. During the war, Julia would travel, often in the company of Jule and the four Grant children, facing unreliable transportation and certain danger to be at her husband's side. Yet Julia and Jule saw two different wars. While Julia spoke out for women—Union and Confederate—she continued to hold Jule as a slave behind Union lines. Upon the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation, Jule claimed her freedom and rose to prominence as a businesswoman in her own right, taking the honorary title Madame. The two women's paths continued to cross throughout the Grants' White House years in Washington, DC, and later in New York City, the site of Grant's Tomb. Mrs. Grant and Madame Jule is the first novel to chronicle this singular relationship, bound by sight and shadow.

This, That, and Another Thing

As a leading Confederate general, Braxton Bragg (1817–1876) earned a reputation for incompetence, for wantonly shooting his own soldiers, and for losing battles. This public image established him not only as a scapegoat for the South's military failures but also as the chief whipping boy of the Confederacy. The strongly negative opinions of Bragg's contemporaries have continued to color assessments of the general's military career and character by generations of historians. Rather than take these assessments at face value, Earl J. Hess's biography offers a much more balanced account of Bragg, the man and the officer. While Hess analyzes Bragg's many campaigns and battles, he also emphasizes how his contemporaries viewed his successes and failures and how these reactions affected Bragg both personally and professionally. The testimony and opinions of other members of the Confederate army--including Bragg's superiors, his fellow generals, and his subordinates--reveal how the general became a symbol for the larger military

failures that undid the Confederacy. By connecting the general's personal life to his military career, Hess positions Bragg as a figure saddled with unwarranted infamy and humanizes him as a flawed yet misunderstood figure in Civil War history.

The author traces this journey, explaining the company's leadership in automotive engineering, its styling successes and failures, its changing management, and its activities from auto racing to defense production to real estate. Throughout, the colorful personalities of its leaders-including Chrysler himself and Lee Iacocca-emerge as strong forces in the company's development, imparting a risk-taking mentality that gave the company its verve.
